

SPACE TUTOR PROGRAMME GUIDELINES

Role of Department

1. Register the NGO/Educational Institution/ Agency/ bodies and for implementing the space tutor programme.
2. Provide the available resource materials, content, information, etc., in the soft form pertaining to ISRO missions, through: documents, videos and images in soft form. However, DOS will not provide any confidential & security concern related information.
3. Encourage and mentor the registered space tutor for organising events and programmes.
4. Help the registered space tutors, on request, to prepare the course content and TLM, DIY kits etc.
5. Arrange participation certificates jointly signed by organiser for a few winners, in case of any competitions are organised with prior intimation

Role of NGOs/Institutions

1. Independently conceive the programmes and events to promote space education.
2. Seeking prior consent to organise events without seeking any financial support.

General Terms and Conditions

1. Efforts shall be taken to ensure accuracy of information in the course content or information prepared independently by registered space tutor for dissemination. ISRO will not be responsible for any representation of non-factual or speculative information which is not authorized by ISRO either in writing or published through the ISRO's official website www.isro.gov.in.
2. Strictly avoid use of unsavoury/obscene content/language, etc.
3. Permitted to use content / images/ videos published in the ISRO's official website as a part of their content or TLM.
4. Provide publicity materials or promotional material subject to availability. It is the responsibility of the you to collect from ISRO's identified offices.

5. ISRO never takes any responsibility of financial aid for organizing the event, fixing of programme cost, organising the facility visits to ISRO centres etc.
6. The registered space tutor shall not part the approved course content by department to any other party or for any commercial use. It is the responsibility of the registered space tutor to take the total liability in case it violates any terms and conditions.
7. The beneficiaries of Space Tutor cannot claim any internship or employment with any ISRO centre or associated institute.
8. ISRO and its officials shall bear no liability or responsibility for any disputes, claims, damages, or issues arising between registered Space Tutors and their participants, beneficiaries, or other third parties engaged in activities under the Space Tutor Programme.
